WHEREAS, the Yuba County Board of Supervisors' 2026-2029 Strategic Plan identified county services as a key Strategic Opportunity and has expressed interest in finding additional beds for Public Guardian Conservatees; and

WHEREAS, Willow Glen Care Center and Sutter Buttes Properties applied for and received a conditional funding award under Bond Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program ("BHCIP") Round 2: Unmet Needs for the development of the Willow Glen 16-Bed Social Rehabilitation Facility Expansion project in Linda, California; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY intends to enter into a Funding Agreement with SUTTER COUNTY to collaborate on the development of the Willow Glen 16-Bed Social Rehabilitation Facility Expansion project (the "Funding Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Grant requires applicants to provide a local match to support the Project under which COUNTY will provide a portion (\$300,000) of the required local match funding to SUTTER COUNTY, in which SUTTER COUNTY will act as the fiscal agent and pass-through entity for such funds to support the Project; and

WHEREAS, the County intends to utilize Health-Social Impact Fees for the COUNTY portion of the required local match funding; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Yuba as follows:

Section 1. That the local match described above is effective beginning the fiscal year following the County Board of Supervisors approval, and County approval and execution of the Funding Agreement with Sutter County.

- a. The County hereby declares its intention to enter into the proposed Funding Agreement with Sutter County for the grant match funds.
- b. The County hereby declares its intention to utilize Health-Social Impact Fees not to exceed Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) dollars for the Willow Glen 16 Bed Facility Expansion Project.
- c. The County Administrator, or his designee, are granted authority to execute the Funding Agreement with Sutter County and any related documents, subject to approval to form by County Counsel.

RE: Commitment of Health-Social Impact Fees as Matching Funds

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter serves as formal confirmation that Yuba County commits Health-Social Impact Fees as matching funds in support of the Bond Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP) Round 2 grant joint application to the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). Yuba County will allocate an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Thousand dollars (\$300,000) for the purposes outlined in the grant proposal.

These funds are available, allowable and dedicated exclusively to meeting the match requirements of the proposed project.
